P.T.F.A.

Next steering group: 14th November

At our AGM last night we reflected upon the many ways in which P.T.F.A. fund raising has helped us to develop our learning environment during the past year. Our biggest expense was refurbishing the boys and girls toilets at a cost of £14,087 but £8,873 was also donated towards school IT equipment.

2011-12 was a year of giving. Each child received a whole school photo to celebrate our 15th birthday, a Jubilee coin was given to mark the queen's diamond year and all the proceeds from the school village cricket match was given to Myton Hospice.

Thank you to Sue Fardoe who took over as chair, Amy Garlick and Jo Bignall who have been secretaries over the year, to Jenny Lomas who has carried out the role of treasurer and to Angie Dumper who has managed the 100+ Club.

A huge thank you to each of you who have made these donations possible through your giving, support of events, sponsoring and collecting all forms of items that can be recycled.

At the AGM Jenny Lomas was re-elected to continue as treasurer but we were unable to elect a Chair, Vice Chair or secretary. If anybody would like to take on any of these roles please contact Mrs Patterson. In the meantime the role of secretary will be shared at the meetings by people willing to take minutes and Mrs Patterson will chair the meetings. We hope that this will be a temporary measure.

Over the year thousands of pounds has been raised through 'easier' methods. The 100+ Club transferred £1,200 to the general fund this year. An amazing effort which is time management effective.

100+ Club is a great way to help us raise funds to be used for the benefit of all the children in school. Numbers are available from Angie Dumper for families and friends of the

school. We have lost quite a number of members this year so please join us and encourage family and friends to buy a number. We are emailing you all with details.

Considerable funds are raised through recycling, please start or continue collecting – details below.

People at the AGM agreed to support the school development plan priorities, and enrich the education of every child in the school further by donating £1,000 to fund the replacement and storage of PE mats. (The current pile failed health and safety tests), £1,000 towards the Early Years environment, £1,000 towards mathematics and £560 to buy 'Mathletics' that children will be able to use in school and at home by using the internet.

Looking forward. During the October half term holiday the ICT cabling network is being updated to improve efficiency and reliability. Once this is completed we will be in a position to look strategically at the best way to move ICT forward, and this will form the focus of future fundraising.
