Feedback from Parent Evaluation

Many thanks to everybody who has returned an evaluation form.

Some questions have arisen in the responses and I am conscious that sometimes I assume that everybody is aware of the wider aspects of the life of the school but that is not always the case. Over the next few weeks I will try to take a topic and share some of our news which I hope you will find useful.

Partnership with other schools

This is an important aspect of our work because it widens opportunities for our young people, enables them to develop personally and socially as they are placed in new contexts and enables them to face greater challenges academically, developing their ideas by working in a larger group with children of a similar ability.

Teachers work together across school partnerships to share and develop expertise that impacts on the quality of teaching and learning for all our children.

Green Leek

Currently our partnership with Burton Green is high on our school agenda. During the year all pupils at All Saints' have shared an experience with children from Burton Green such as sharing Christmas performances, visits to All Saints' Church together and our Year 2 music day.

Our School Councils are working together on their poetry competition this week.

During this half term Years 5 and 6 will join with Burton Green Year 6 to share a computing and programming day prior to our residential visit to France.

Year 5 will be the focus of some Amazing Maths group challenges, this term and next.

The Kenilworth Learning Community

All Saints' is a member of the Kenilworth Learning Community. This includes every school in Kenilworth from the nursery school to our secondary school.

Teachers work closely together to moderate work and share training. Head Teachers discuss and develop more effective ways of engaging children in their learning. An important aspect of this is ensuring that transition to secondary school is well prepared and smooth. Teachers from Kenilworth School liaise closely with Year 6 teachers. Currently they are sharing their expertise in Level 6 reading in order for primary schools to challenge their most able readers.

Sport is a regular, well established aspect of this partnership and children throughout Key Stage 2 access some events that are planned and led by the Kenilworth school 'Young leaders' such as sports festivals. Inter school competitions include swimming, football, cross country, netball and athletics.

Children also have the opportunity to participate in central Warwickshire leagues and events.

Wider afield

We strive to enable children to widen their understanding of the world they live in through national and international links. Year 2 share visits with All Saints' Bedworth and as you know we have well established links with Akany Avoko. We are currently beginning to work with the Warwick Schools to become part of a well-established link that they have developed with Bo in Sierra Leone. We have been partnered with The Holy Rosary School in Bo. Children in Dudley have sent work to the school and this week we have received stories back.
