From September 2014 all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will be provided with a Free School Meal, although parents will still be able to send in a packed lunch if they wish to.

Since pupil premium funding will continue to be based on eligibility for Free School Meals, I would urge all parents to register for Free School Meals. This can be done via

Children in Key Stage 2 will continue to pay for their meals. The cost of meals from September will be £2.15 per day.
