We are extremely proud of our Year 2 children's efforts in their end of Key Stage assessments this week. They have all persevered and worked hard. Well done all of you!

A huge thank you to Captain Fred Hawker who organised a fantastic, unique day at Birmingham airport for all of our Year 3 and 4 children. "It was the best trip ever" was overheard from an enthusiastic participant on their return.

It was good to see mathematics being used as the means for all of our Green Leek Year 5 children to work together this week. They had a super day generating lots of problem solving ideas and strategies. Everybody enjoyed using the 'New Land' at Burton Green at lunchtime and lots of fun was had.

We also had a super evening on Tuesday night when a large group of Green Leek younger cricketers played in two matches at Leek Wootton Social Club. The weather was kind and the spoils were even. All Saints' won one match and Burton Green the other.

A big thank you to all of our adult cricketers who made the evening a real success. The cricket was exciting and played with good spirit. All Saints' narrowly won by 5 runs. Plenty of burgers and hot dogs were sold and as a result £346 was raised, £173 for each school. This was a new event and I really appreciate your support.

We were very fortunate to have: an informative, interesting presentation and quiz; a demonstration from both the airport's fire service and dog handlers; explore

an empty plane (even the cockpit!). Very special, thanks to Fred Hawker and Mandy for organising such a brilliant day.

Waller Class: This week the class have taken part in some fantastic activities with Year 5 having a day of 'Amazing Maths' with the children of Burton Green and the Year 4 children taking a trip to Birmingham Airport. We have reflected upon and evaluated these experiences, and have written reports and letters. Our other maths this week has focused on plotting coordinates, reflections and translations of shapes. In literacy we have been continuing to explore the features of non-chronological reports, in preparation for our 'hot tasks'.

Wise Class: In Wise Class this week we have been writing balanced arguments about whether or not under 12's should be allowed mobile phones. We have found that there are as many arguments against this, as there are for!

In maths, we have been calculating the area, perimeter and volume of shapes and have worked really hard to work out the volume of cylinders and triangular prisms- our brains are still very active!. The children have now been told their parts in the end of year production: CD's with practice music will follow soon.
