This week's news

Some days begin with a wonderful surprise and today's came in the form of a cheque for £400 raised by the Gibson family through cake sales they have run. A big thank you.

During the holiday I met with the architect and builders and I am delighted to tell you that work on the ICT suite refurbishment is scheduled to begin on the 2nd July. This involves not only the replacement of all PCs but also refitting and reorganising the suite to enable it to be used most effectively. Air conditioning is also being installed.

We have most of the funding in place but need to raise approximately £4,000 to complete the purchase of PCs, a flat screen touchscreen and furniture

This has been a week of preparation as our residential visit to France draws closer. Years 5 and 6 have explored the history behind our visits to the D Day beaches.

We are hoping for the fine weather to continue as we look forward to a weekend of celebrations for the Queen's 90th Birthday celebrations. Class Highlights of the Week:

We've begun to explore friendships and relationships.

The Castles Home Learning is due in on Friday 15th July. Apologies for the mistake on the sheet. It has a literacy focus this time so we're expecting the

children's best writing.

Dudley Class: It was 'Spring Fever' week this week. Lots of interesting ideas and questions came about (lots of questions indeed!). Everyone behaved very maturely and listened brilliantly to what their peers had to say.

Waller Class: Waller's highlight of the week. The focus for this week has very much been on 'Spring Fever' which links with work to be done this term in Science. Year 4 have been preparing for the 'Day of the African Child' next week while Year 5 have been exploring some of the history of D Day which will help them have a better appreciation of their experience on the visit to France.

Meanwhile... in maths we have been focussing on written division calculations having completed our cold task.

Wise Class: In Year 6 this week we have been writing our narrative stories set in a beach environment. The class have been adding exciting description, speech which develops the story line and all of their high quality punctuation. We just have the editing process to finish and then we will be done!

We have been looking at 'what makes us who we are'

in PSHE and how everyone is important and should be valued. We're hoping to go full swing into rehearsals for Jungle Book next week. Thank you for your 'patience' and support while the children continue to learn their words and songs.
