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This week's news

End of Year Reports went out this week, I hope that you received your child's. Over the last two weeks I have read what the teachers have written about each of the children and the over-arching view that I have received is what a tremendous amount of effort and hard work has gone in a wide variety of learning opportunities this year, both by children and adults.

I have enjoyed two incredible end of year, Year 5 and 6 performances of 'Jungle Book' The children as a whole, and as individuals never cease to amaze with their range of dramatic and musical talents. So much talent from every child was on display. Once again this was a truly memorable experience. Well done to you all. Many thanks to Mrs Duxbury, our producer and musical director and to Mrs Kingston with her nifty needle helped by Mrs Perryman and Mrs Garlick. The costumes were amazing.

End of Key Stage Assessment Results

As we come to the end of term we would like to celebrate the achievements of children in both Year 2 and Year 6. Each child should feel very proud of what they have achieved. This is the result of their considerable hard work and their high expectations of what they can achieve. The cohort in Key Stage 1 is 20 and in Key Stage 2 is 19. As you will be aware this year has had a considerable number of challenges around assessments with systems that have been in place for many years being replaced. The expectations of the standard at the end of Key Stages 1 and 2 has risen considerably so we awaited with interest to see how well our children have achieved when compared with other schools nationally.

Year 1 Phonics

100% of our children are working at the expected standard. Well done to Mrs Batts, Mrs Greyson, Mrs Rose, Mrs Burrows, Mrs Stranks and Mrs Gardner. This is an amazing result and really shows the impact of the way in which we teach Letters and Sounds. Thank you to everybody who has made it possible for us to start promptly each morning. The children have really benefitted.

Key Stage 1

Reading Working at the expected standard 85% of whom 25% were working at greater depth.
Writing Working at the expected standard 80% of whom 20% were working at greater depth.
Mathematics Working at the expected standard 75% of whom 20% were working at greater depth.

As this is the first year of new assessment systems we await comparative data but we believe this to be above the local authority and national average.

Key Stage 2

Reading School result: Working at the expected standard 84.2%
National result: Working at the expected standard 66%

Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling School result: Working at the expected standard 89.5%
National result: Working at the expected standard 72%

Mathematics School result: Working at the expected standard 79%
National result: Working at the expected standard 70%

Writing Assessment School result: Working at the expected standard 95% of whom 63% were working at greater depth.

We believe this to be an excellent result and shows the impact of a school development priority this year.

Science Working at the expected standard 95%
Teacher Assessment

Reading, Writing and Mathematics: Working at the expected standard in all 3 areas school result 79%, national result 53%. This is an excellent result.

Please note that it is only in writing that we are allowed to award working at greater depth.

I would like to thank children and parents for their efforts. Congratulations to you all. High achievement is not possible without a dedicated staff throughout the school. I would like to thank my staff for the commitment they continually show to do their best for our children.

On your children's reports I'm sure you will have noticed the comment: ...is working towards year group expectations, is working in line with years group expectations or is exceeding year group expectations expectations, This is the new format of assessing progress and has been reported to all parents this year. This gives you an idea of whether you child is below where they should be, where they should be or above where they should be.

Class Highlights of the Week:

Oak Class: This week in Oak we had a fun packed minibeast day on Monday. Everyone looked amazing for the ugly bug ball. Oak class practised how to dance like as if they were at Cinderella's Ball. In maths we have been problem solving and finding all possibilities, by making caterpillars and ice creams. Sports Day preparations are coming along well. Next week: All children in Oak need a named carrier bag to take home goodies.

Helpers would be appreciated to walk with us to church on Wednesday.

Ash Class: We've danced up a storm and as grasshoppers out on the grass for our Ugly Bug Ball. Well done for your wonderful costume efforts! We took rulers and metre sticks outside this week to practise our measuring skills. We drew scale models of the playground equipment using our careful measurements. It was great to take our learning outdoors!

Dudley Class: Dudley have had great fun using the ipads this week, using a great variety of apps to reflect on the year 5&6 production (Jungle Book). They also had their final swimming session, which was a very fun 'play' session.

Waller Class: This week we have been writing and comparing stories about Sikh Gurus, with those of the Christian Saints and asking, "What does it mean to live a 'saintly life' ?". We have prepared an owner's manual for teenagers, giving advice on how to keep your teenager happy and healthy, both physically and emotionally.

Wise Class: In Wise Class this week, we have been putting the finishing touches to our cross-stitch pictures of the school. The children have designed their own imaginative frames to keep their work in


