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Welcome

This week we have welcomed our new Reception intake. Well done to Aiyana, Dexter, Rachel, Jessica, Lily, Fletcher, Joel, Lucas, Charlie, Oskar, Jelena, Oscar, Archie, Sofia, Lucy, Edward, James, Lucy, Lola, Kiera and Isabelle who have settled in really well.

We have been working together to evaluate ways in which we can continue to improve learning opportunities. This week I am sending out the 'Home Learning' leaflet. Your support at home is really appreciated and impacts on the progress your child makes. We want to maximise this positive effect and have looked carefully at the type of activities that we think will enable the children to secure the basic skills in reading, writing and maths. We are placing greater emphasis on clear tasks that support targets set, and directed tasks that enable them to develop their spelling, grammar and punctuation. Weekly Maths tasks have been introduced in Key Stage 1. We hope that the children will work independently and that the support they need from you will be more manageable and time efficient.

Laying of Stones Special Assembly October 19th

We would like to invite the parents and friends of children in Reception and children new to the school, to join us for the special assembly on Wednesday October 19th. We would like each child to bring a stone with their name and date of entry to All Saints' painted on it. This will be placed in the Peace Garden as part of this special time.

Class Highlights of the Week:

Oak Class: The new reception children have been totally amazing this week! They have been so grown up and independent first thing in the morning and they have handled so many new experiences very well such as assemblies, playtimes and lunches.

This week we have read the story 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea.' Year 1's have created their own versions of the story. Along with lots of songs and number games, the Year 1's have been trying to find ways to make 5 using maths equipment.

Ash Class: We've enjoyed finding out about grandparents this week and are beginning to think

how life would have been different in the past. In literacy we've learnt how to label maps and had fun designing our own dinosaur park.

Year 1 & 2 We still have space for a helper for our Compton Verney trip on 29 September. Please see Mrs Rose if you would like to help.

Dudley Class: Another great, hard-working week. It definitely does not feel like the second week of term; everyone is adapting well to the routines of this year. Well done to Year 4 in Dudley, who are becoming excellent role models. A particular highlight has been learning tag rugby which Dudley are thoroughly enjoying.

Waller Class: In literacy we have been reading and analysing the 'Just So' stories of Rudyard Kipling, looking at the characters, settings, and writing techniques that Kipling uses to interest and engage his audience.

Our maths focus was column addition and subtraction written methods. In history we have begun to look at life in the stone age.

Wise Class: In Wise Class this week we have been focusing on addition of decimals in maths and being able to work both quickly and accurately. In Literacy we have continued to look at persuasive writing techniques and had fun thinking about rhetorical sentences and what they really mean.

We have begun our still life art pictures about 'ourselves' and have creatively added to our 'Blitz' themed dances- all in all a very busy week!
