End of Key Stage Assessment Results

As we come to the end of term we would like to celebrate the achievements of children in both Year 2 and Year 6.

Each child should feel very proud of what they have achieved. This is the result of their considerable hard work and their high expectations of what they can achieve. The cohort in Key Stage 1 is 20 and in Key Stage 2 is 20.

The expectations of the standard at the end of Key Stages 1 and 2 continue to rise year on year.

Year 1 Phonics

For the second year running 100% of our children are working at the expected standard. Well done to Mrs Batts, Mrs Greyson, Mrs Rose, Mrs Burrows, Mrs Stranks and Mrs Gardner. This is an amazing result and really shows the impact of the way in which we teach Letters and Sounds. Thank you to everybody who has made it possible for us to start promptly each morning. The children have really benefitted.

Key Stage 1

Reading: Working at the expected standard 95% of whom 40% were working at greater depth.

Writing: Working at the expected standard 80% of whom 25% were working at greater depth.

Mathematics: Working at the expected standard 85% of whom 25% were working at greater depth.

We await comparative data but we believe this to be above the local authority and national average.

Key Stage 2

Reading: School result: Working at the expected standard 85%

National result: Working at the expected standard 71%

Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling School result: Working at the expected standard 90%

National result: Working at the expected standard 77%

Mathematics School result: Working at the expected standard 95%

National result: Working at the expected standard 75%

Writing Assessment School result: Working at the expected standard 90% of 30% were working at greater depth.

Reading, Writing and Mathematics: Working at the expected standard in all 3 areas school result 85%, national result 61%. This is an excellent result.

Please note that it is only in writing that we are allowed to award working at greater depth.

I would like to thank children and parents for their efforts. Congratulations to you all. High achievement is not possible without a dedicated staff throughout the school. I would like to thank my staff for the commitment they continually show to do their best for our children.

On your children's reports I'm sure you will have noticed the comment: ...is working towards year group expectations, is working in line with year group expectations or is exceeding year group expectations, This gives you an idea of whether your child is below where they should be, where they should be or above where they should be.

Class Highlights of the Week:

Oak Class: This week we have had lots of end of term fun; shared activities such as Wellie Wednesday den building with our friends at Burton Green and enjoyed a fantastic seaside and pirate day.

We also explored different Bible stories, which the children worked in groups to re-enact. Using scripts and stage directions they had previously produced, everyone worked hard to share their Bible story in an exciting, engaging way.

Waller Class: This week in Literacy we have been analysing and commenting on the structure and purpose of debate poetry. WE have been writing rhyming couplets (a la Shakespeare!) and using figurative language to personify the sun and the north wind. We have continued to apply our writing skills across the curriculum by writing information leaflets in our 'Rivers' project and biographies in RE, focussing specifically on people who have changed the world.

A big round of applause to Year 5 whose dedication, enthusiasm and talent help make Midsummer Night's Dream so memorable!

Wise Class: Wise Class this week have been in full production mode as we have enjoyed performing ' A Midsummer Night's Dream'. All children should be thoroughly delighted with their individual contributions. I hope that all parents enjoyed the play too.
