Class Highlights of the Week:

Oak Class: On Super Learning Day for Peace and Reconciliation, we learnt how to be a good friend. We read the story of Elmer the elephant and talked about what fun he has with the other herd of elephants. In maths we have been learning how to count on, by putting a number in our heads and counting on. Year 1's soon realised how important it is to count on accurately. In literacy, we have been reading poems about cats and dogs. We learnt how to recite and perform a poem in front of others. During Mucky Monday, we focussed on the beautiful trees we have in our school grounds. Activities included sketching and making mud badges on the trees and even tree hugging!

The children collected adjectives to describe the wolf's appearance, wrote wanted posters and descriptions of the wolf they imagined was hiding in the box. They had wonderful ideas, describing its sharp pointy teeth, red staring eyes and shaggy fur that smelt like a rubbish dump!

Dudley Class: What a super week Dudley have had learning more about fables and morals of the story! They have been practising using speech punctuation accurately and finding different words instead of said! (she whispered!) In numeracy the children have been whizzing through their torture tables at a healthy pace. Super learning day was a very special time when everyone developed their understanding of the word "peace" in a peaceful and calming environment.

Waller Class: A week of 'whiz-poppingly' marvellous learning experiences this week! Children have certainly accelerated from second gear right into fifth. In numeracy this week, we have been investigating more formal written methods for subtraction and have also been 'rocketing on' with our times tables. Next week, I am looking forward to moving on to the next unit, which will be poetry. Please remember to keep supporting your child's reading and encourage them to read every day.
