### Primary School's Sports Funding Report 2015-2016

The Government has provided, primary school sport funding to primary school Head Teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. All schools receive a lump sum of £8,000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil for the next two academic years. For the academic year 2015/16 All Saints' received £8,590 PE and Sports Grant. This was made up of the £8,000 lump sum plus £5 each for the 118 pupils in Year 1 to Year 6 (January 2014 census).

#### Purpose of Funding

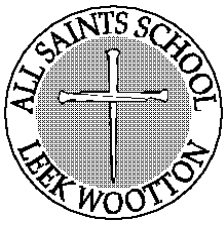
Schools will have to spend the funding on improving their provision of PE and school sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

#### AIMS

- To ensure strong leadership continues to inspire others.
- To enable staff to develop their own skills to deliver the PE and Sports Curriculum.
- To provide some specialist PE teaching to children throughout the school.
- To maintaining and further encourage children to take part in sport.
- To enable children to participate in intra school competition, interschool sports festivals and competitions.
- To providing quality assured materials for PE and school sport.
- To continue to widen opportunities through after school sports clubs.

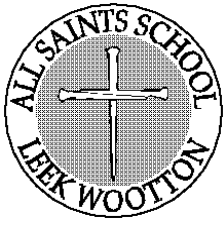
#### IMPACT OF SCHOOL SPORTS PREMIUM FUNDING 2015-2016

<p><b>High profile given through leadership</b> <b>£3,500</b></p>	<p><b>Does Sport have a high profile in the school? How would this be evidenced?</b></p> <p>Children and parents share the school's expectations that children from Reception to Year 6 will participate in regular physical activity and that this supports an active healthy lifestyle. All children receive 2 hours PE each week and have the opportunity to participate in after schools activities. The range of sporting activities is indicative of strong leadership of PE throughout the school, from subject leadership to support from the senior leadership team.</p> <p>PE and Sport has a high profile throughout the school with high percentages of children participating in additional activities. This significantly increases as the children move through the school.</p> <p>Sporting activities have a high profile in achievement assemblies, newsletters, match reports and displays. A sports page is available on the school website. The school community are informed of events and success is celebrated</p>
<p><b>Better Teaching</b> <b>£1,000</b></p>	<p><b>Is PE Teaching improving? Where is the evidence?</b></p> <p>As part of her PE leadership role the subject leader has supported the development of planning with class teachers and sports coaches. A system is in place to track the progress each child makes. Children are beginning to use ICT to evaluate their own performance.</p> <p>As a result of ongoing, good quality teaching children have successfully taken part in festivals to demonstrate their skills and competitions to apply their skills.</p> <p>The subject leader and class teachers have accessed a range of one off and ongoing CPD opportunities.</p> <p>Opportunities to coach alongside specialist sports coaches- provision of additional swimming coach for children in Years 3-5;</p> <p>Specialist cricket coaching from TSR ( Try Scoring Runs);</p> <p>Teacher with specialist PE skills and knowledge to support ongoing staff professional development.</p> <p>The school has a significant number of teachers who teach a range of different aspects of PE and sport confidently.</p> <p>Appointment of a specialist sports coach to teach generic games skills to children from Reception to</p>

	<p>Year 2 to enable them to develop the skills necessary to participate fully, and enjoy, playing games; Appointment of a specialist sports coach to teach team games skills and athletics skills to children from Year 3 to Year 6 to enable them to develop the skills necessary to participate fully, and enjoy team games and widen participation in a wider range of cluster opportunities skilfully.</p>
<p><b>Feeding to external clubs (and expertise) £500</b></p>	<p><b>Are children actually taking up sport following the formation of links?</b>  Links have been established with a range of local clubs who support teaching within and beyond the school day. Teachers benefit from working alongside additional specialist coaches at the local swimming pool. Specialist cricket coaching from Warwickshire County Cricket Club is well established and is the basis of close links with our local cricket club who support after school clubs and evening cricket coaching accessed by the children. A specialist football coach working in our after school club provides a close link with a local football club and many children go on to play for this club as a result.  Our local tennis club provides specialist after school coaching during the summer term.  Links are being built with the local orienteering club through an after school club and 'The Warwickshire' facilities are used for cross country training.  In addition many children participate in local community sports clubs, particularly cricket, rugby, football, swimming, orienteering and athletics.</p>
<p><b>Opportunities to compete and demonstrate skills £1,000</b></p>	<p><b>Are children having the opportunity to compete?</b>  This year we have increased the number of opportunities for children to participate in intra school competitions- netball, football, rounders, and cricket.  The school is an active member of our local cluster of schools sporting association (KDPSA) and subscribes to a wide range of league opportunities- Central Warwickshire cross country and Central Warwickshire small schools football league. In addition this year children have participated in gym dance festivals, cricket festivals, swimming gala, indoor and outdoor athletics competitions.  Sports coach preparation for indoor sports hall athletics for Years 5 and 6.  As a result of success at local level individual children have competed in county cross country championships and national orienteering championships.</p>
<p><b>Broader Range of Opportunities £2,800</b></p>	<p><b>Is there a broader range, than before the grant, of, sports opportunities?</b>  The school has continued to build upon a strong sporting tradition. Increased emphasis is given to developing basic skills that underpin a wide range of traditional and new sports with our younger children who have been taught in groups of 20 for 1 lesson per week.  Additional activities have been added to a full after school sports programme.  Early Years- football, multi-skills, dodge ball, circus skills, street dance;  Key Stage 1- football, multi-skills, dodge ball, tennis, circus skills, street dance.  Key Stage 2- gymnastics, netball, cross country, football, athletics, rounders, cricket, tennis and tag Rugby, circus skills, street dance.  Orienteering begins summer term 2016.  A biannual residential visit for Years 5 and 6 has a physical activity focus and widens the range of sports the children experience including outdoor adventure, climbing, fencing, archery</p>
<p><b>Encouraging specific children</b></p>	<p><b>Are specific children being encouraged into sport? Us paying their fees? Leadership encouragement?</b>  The school has maintained a high % of children attending after school sports opportunities.  % of children who have attended a school sports club at some point during the last Year: Early Years: 35%, Key Stage 1: 62%, Key Stage 2: 75%- Year 6 100%.  More Key Stage 2 girls have participated in a wider range of clubs including football and gymnastics. Children who show a particular talent in a specific area are encouraged by leadership, including attendance at events, to participate at the highest level they are able to.</p>
<p><b>Improved Facilities £250</b></p>	<p><b>Have our facilities improved? What have we purchased/ intend to purchase?</b>  The extra funding has enabled the school to provide more equipment to be used in PE lessons to encourage full and active participation. This is continually updated.</p>
